	 periodically. There have been two years of difficulty facing all clubs. Discussion held on whether fees should remain the same, to support members and clubs by not increasing costs. For context, NZIHF provided rebates to regions in 2020. Regions and clubs have received significant investment from NZIHF. NZIHF needs to improve its communication to players about what these funds go to. Clubs also need to assist with communicating this. Turner suggested NZIHF put together an information pack explaining what funds are spent on and how they support regions. Fontaine added that CIHA has experienced an increase to their local fees and would appreciate the NZIHF to not increase registration fees for 2023. Echoed by Southern.

- A small number of people do a lot of hard work, but we should aim to see strong demand for these roles, which indicates a strong and represented NZIHF.
- McIntyre added that all club presidents are invited to all Management Committee meetings, but we want to see more representation.
- The more we hear from people, the better decisions we can make.
- Discussion held on maintaining equa representation through all regions and clubs.
